ILLiad is Here!

New Interlibrary Loan (ILL) System

Auburn University Libraries has moved to a new Interlibrary Loan management system. This system, named OCLC ILLiad, will simplify the request process by allowing patrons to: enter address and other personal information only once and view the status and history of all ILL/AUBIExpress requests within one form.

Access to the new system is available by clicking on the “**Interlibrary Loan/AUBIExpress**” link located near the center of the [A.U. Libraries homepage](#). The system will request your Auburn OIT (NOT vetmed) user name and password.

When logging in for the first time, you will be required to submit the following information: name, email address, daytime phone, mailing address, department (a drop down list is provided—choose **Veterinary Medicine**), and make sure to change Delivery Location to **Vet Med Circulation**. This will have the materials you request sent here for pick up.

This new system is able to keep track and display information on each ILL and AubieExpress request submitted.

Please remember that when filling out any request to give us as much information as you possibly can. The more information you provide, the faster and more accurately your request will be returned to you.

How To:

Sync your OIT and Vet Med Passwords

If you do not remember your OIT username and password, contact the Computer Group at 4-4512, otherwise:

1. Go to the Auburn Password Page, <https://oitapps.auburn.edu/Password/pgPassword.aspx>
2. Enter the required information. It may take up to 15 minutes for the change to go into effect.

Spring Semester 2007 Reserves

Well, Fall semester is almost over, and it's already time to begin thinking about Spring semester 2007. By providing us with the information on the items you want placed on reserve for next semester, you allow us time to recall items that have been checked out or order items the library does not currently own.

When sending information to us, please include the following: item title, edition, call number (if you have it), and how long you would like students to be able to check it out. Default time for reserve materials is 2-hours, but we can also lend them out for 4-hours, 24-hours, or 7 days.

Due to copyright law, any item on reserve this semester can not be automatically carried over to the next semester; they must be re-submitted. Also, students may not place items on reserve; we must receive the request from the professor or course coordinator.
